On 20th March 2023 we received the following request for information from you: -

Climate emergency declared July 2019

According to your Sustainable Hertfordshire web page, HCC declared a climate emergency in July 2019. On what basis was this declaration made? Can HCC prove this climate emergency exists?

## Our Response

Your request for information has been considered under the Environmental Information Regulations 2004. I can confirm that Hertfordshire County Council does hold the information you have requested, and can respond as follows: -

Hertfordshire County Council declared a climate emergency in 2019 in response to international scientific consensus as well as national and local evidence.

The overwhelming scientific consensus is that anthropogenic carbon emissions have caused a climate crisis that is already harming communities across the world and will continue to do so in future. You can see <u>long-term changes in the average global temperature here</u> and <u>the graph here shows the increase in carbon emissions and global surface temperature since 1880.</u>

Giving one example in the UK, <u>research shows that last year's summer heatwave was made at least 10 times more likely because of climate change.</u> The heatwave had severe and widespread impacts on infrastructure, nature, and public health. During this time (between June and August 2022), <u>2803 more people aged 65 and over died in England than would have otherwise.</u>

An up-to-date global analysis of the causes of the climate crisis, its impacts, and how immediate action can limit future harm, can be read in the <u>Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC)'s most recent report.</u>

Hertfordshire County Council's declaration of a climate emergency in 2019 reflects our responsibilities to current and future communities to act upon this evidence. You can view the <u>Strategy and Action Plan</u> that were subsequently approved and see the wide range of service areas that they cover.
